The latest assessment is the teacher's professional prediction of the grade that the student would get at the end of the course if the only information they had available to them was the result of the recently assessed piece of work.

The ALPS target grade is the grade the student is expected to achieve at the end of A Level study based on their prior attainment. (Renamed as 'Target Grade' on current reports)

A shared course, split between Fitzharrys and Larkmead school

Attitude to learning in lessons is assessed on whether the student is punctual, participates actively and concentrates.

Attitude to learning beyond lessons is assessed on whether the student takes steps to catch up, meets deadlines, produces work that reflects their ability, and undertakes independent studies.

Assessment levels for both are:
1 = meets all the criteria
2 = meets most of the criteria
3 = meets some of the criteria
4 = meets few of the criteria

Both forecast grades and latest assessment grades can be 'fine graded' to give a more detailed indication of where the student is working within the grade, e.g:

- C1 - secure C grade but with intervention could boost to a B grade.
- C2 - insecure C grade, intervention necessary to secure the C grade.
- C3 - very insecure C grade, intervention certainly necessary to secure C grade.

The percentage of all lessons with this teacher that the student has attended so far this academic year. (Some teachers combine their figures - in this example the student attended every lesson with both NTM and WRS)
